Welcome and Introduction:

Manuel Bettencourt, Chair, welcomed those in attendance and asked them to introduce themselves. Mr. Bettencourt referred to the meeting ground rules requesting that everyone abide by them.

The meeting continued with Manuel Bettencourt introducing the first speaker, Ms. Dawn Gillas, to present the Low Enriched Uranium Oxide Shipments using the 9976 Package for shipping.

Low Enriched Oxide Shipments using the 9976 Package:

Ms. Dawn Gillas, Nuclear Engineer, DOE-SR Office of the Assistant Manager for Nuclear Materials Stabilization, provided a presentation on the Low Enriched Uranium Oxide (LEUO) Shipments using the 9976 Package. Ms. Gillas explained what and how LEUO was generated and stored at SRS, and why the special packaging was needed. Ms. Gillas stated that the safe, successful completion of the shipments of LEUO from SRS to the Nevada Test Site was an excellent example of teamwork to accomplish the reduction of legacy material. The presentation was a good news story and well received with few questions.

Plutonium Vitrification Update (*draft motion*):

The meeting continued with the review and open discussions of the Plutonium Vitrification Update (*draft motion*) introduced by Manuel Bettencourt, NM Chair, and Judy Green-McLeod, NM committee member. Mr. Pat McGuire and Mr. Robert Edwards, DOE-SR Office of the Assistant Manager for Nuclear Materials Stabilization, attended the meeting and provided important, consistent responses to the CAB member's questions. Open discussions stated that the *draft motion* reinforces the SRS CAB's support for the rapid disposition of stored plutonium at SRS and across the DOE-complex and that while considerable progress has been made to identify and approve vitrification as the preferred technology alternative for the plutonium disposition, many of the SRS CAB's original questions remain unanswered. The SRS CAB members are skeptical of achieving the facility schedule based upon the funding needs.

The SRS CAB wants to know more about the impact on the current schedule and of any potential delays that may occur on the Defense Waste Processing Facility (DWPF) operational schedule. The meeting concluded with the understanding that all comments would be incorporated and the *draft motion* will be presented at the Combined Committee meeting on January 22 and recommended for adoption at the Full Board meeting on January 23, 2007.
