Committee Welcome: Cathy Patterson, FDSR Vice Chair

CAB member Patterson welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Point of Contact Status Update: Avery Hammett, DOE-SR

Mrs. Hammett reviewed the current projects related to the committee prevue. She noted that there was an update to the exceedance noted at the previous full board meeting – the conclusion was that it was a lab error.

Committee Discussion: Community Involvement Plan

CAB member Patterson opened discussion on the presentation given at the previous full board meeting regarding the Community Involvement Plan. CAB member Daniel Kaminski asked if SRS had rated the current CIP to see if it met its goals. Michael Mikolanis, DOE-SR, noted that the development and execution solicits topics of interest and ways to reach the public from public input, which contributes to the creation of the CIP. He continued to note that this plan is updated and reviewed every three years or as appropriate, which is why public opinion is currently being sought. Brian Hennessey, DOE-SR, noted that the last update to this plan stated that DOE-SR stated they were going to gather new public concerns in the next revision, and the CIP is not a script for the Community Involvement Program. He noted that there is a lot of preparation and work being done for outreach and public interact which goes above and beyond. He continued to note that the CIP covers requirements and not all emerging issues. Deidre Lloyd, EPA, noted that the CIP is a robust plan. CAB member Patterson went through each objective, asking for CAB input on how they're being carried out.
