What is NEPA?



- National Environmental Policy Act of 1969
 - Signed into law by President Nixon on January 1, 1970
- Promotes government transparency and gives the public a voice in government decisionmaking

Laws on Environmental Protection





- Title I:
 - To declare a national policy which will encourage productive and enjoyable harmony between man and his environment;
 - To promote efforts which will prevent or eliminate damage to the environment and biosphere and stimulate the health and welfare of man; and
 - To enrich the understanding of the ecological systems and natural resources important to the Nation.
- Title II:
 - To establish a Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ)

SRNS

- A broad range of Federal actions are subject to NEPA:
 - Proposed on or requires passage on Federal land
 - Funded by Federal money
 - Requires a Federal permit
 - A Federal Agency is a partner





When is NEPA implemented?



- NEPA considerations commence when a Federal agency develops a proposal to address a need and:
 - Has a goal
 - Is actively making a decision
 - Has one or more alternative ways of accomplishing the goal
 - Can meaningfully evaluate the effects of a proposed action

Environmental Management System

- SRS implements an Environmental Management System (EMS) that conforms to ISO 14001:2015
- NEPA considerations are a key step in the <u>PLAN</u> phase of SRS's EMS
 - Site Use/Site Clearance
 - Work Package Development
 - Project Scoping Meetings
 - Environmental Evaluation Checklists (EECs)
 - EECs document SRS's NEPA Evaluation Recommendations







Environmental Evaluation Checklist (EEC)

SRNS

<u>Purpose</u>

- 1. Documents the NEPA Evaluation (CX, EA, EIS)
- 2. Ensures regulatory and permitting requirements are identified
- 3. Identifies potential impacts to the environment





- CXs are groups of actions that DOE has determined would not have a significant impact on the environment.
- 2 groups of CXs identified in 10 CFR 1021:
 - Appendix A No external posting is required
 - General Agency Actions contracts, information gathering, technical advice, etc.
 - Appendix B External posting is required
 - Maintenance, safety, and health improvements
 - D&D, remediation
 - R&D, sampling/monitoring, conservation research





- If extraordinary circumstances are present or conditions of integral elements are not met, then the action will require additional NEPA evaluation beyond a CX.
 - *Extraordinary circumstances* scientific controversy of impacts; uncertain effects; unique or unknown risks, etc.
 - Integral Elements regulatory/permit violations; uncontrolled/unpermitted release of hazardous substance; threatened/endangered species impacts, unmitigated and non-permitted wetlands impacts, etc.



CX Requirements, continued



• No segmentation – breaking of an action/project into smaller pieces to avoid the appearance of significant impacts. Think about a shopping mall...

Summary of CX Determinations









- NEPA is a federal requirement.
- Public involvement is a key component of NEPA.
- NEPA is part of the planning process and guides DOE in decision making.
- There are 3 major levels of NEPA evaluations CXs, EAs, and EISs.
- The vast majority of NEPA evaluations conducted at SRS result in CXs.
