#### **National Historic Preservation Act**

#### Fostered the system by which federal agencies:

- Survey and identify districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, and culture, and use this information to plan projects, where possible, historic places are preserved.
- Use this information to plan projects so, where possible, historic places are preserved.



#### **Programmatic Agreement**



Developed with State Historic Preservation Office, Advisory Council, and local stakeholders

For the identification and treatment of resources and artifacts that date from the Site's selection to the end of the Cold War.

- We identify facilities for preservation
- We write histories
- We collect and manage artifacts

"This is not what we want, not what we're looking for. We don't want escala-tion," Birlown said. "We don't want to see our fosces or our personal come under fine. Bariffuh targettes, we're soady for it." Austin, echoring Blinkers, said "what we're seeing is a prospect of a significant escalation of attacks on our troops and our people throughout the region. He said the U.S. has the right to self-defense "and we won't hesitate to take the

appropriate action." The warning from the high-ranking U.S. officials came as Israel's military re-sponse to a deadly Ckt. 7 attack by Haman civilians in communities in southern Israel entered its third week.

Israeli warplanes strack targets across Gaza overnight and into Sunday, as well as two airports in Syria and a mosque in the occupied West Bank allegedly used by militants as the war threatened to engulf more of the Middle East. Israel has traded fire with Lebanon's Hezbollah militant group on a near-daily

basis since the war began, and tensions are soaring in the Israeli-occupied West Bank, where Israeli forces have battled militants in refugee camps and carried out two airstrikes in recent days. The U.S. announced Sunday that new essential staffat its embassy in Iraq should leave the country: Binken, who recently spent several days

in the region, spoke of a "likelihood of es-calation" while saying no one wants to see a second or third front to the hostilities beveen Israel and Harras, which rules Gaza He said he expects "escalation by Irania provies directed against our forces, di "We are taking steps to male sure that we can effectively defend our people and respond decisively if we need to."
